GVPC and Haiti Relief - Great Valley supports Haitian relief through RMI (Reciprocal Ministries International), a Christian organization which helps churches from the USA establish sister-church relationships with evangelical churches in Haiti for the benefit of both congregations. In 1987, we began partnering with the church in Cance, about 90 miles south of Port-au-Prince. We've made several trips to visit and to serve our dear Christian brothers and sisters in a variety of ways: funding a well, constructing the church roof and benches, providing Bibles, songbooks, sports equipment and musical instruments (including a banjo from Gary Fairbairn!). In 2008, our team delivered a sound system so their overflow crowds could hear and participate in worship services. Through "Hope for Kidz," an outgrowth of the sister-church program, Great Valley families provide tuition, uniforms, shoes, books and medical checkups to over 100 children who could not otherwise afford it, enabling them to attend the Christian school nearby.

RMI is working with relief agencies to help earthquake victims and their families, as hundreds of thousands of refugees flood the countryside fleeing the devastation and lack of basic needs in Port-au-Prince. They descend on family, friends, and churches with nothing but the clothes on their backs and maybe a few personal items they could carry in a bundle on their head.

Les Cayes, where RMI is headquartered, is feeling the crush. Refugees who had been part of a MEBSH church in Port (the Haitian church association RMI has partnered with for 30+ years) are flocking to the MEBSH churches in the area as they have nowhere else to go. The hospitals there, including the 2 mission hospitals, are overwhelmed by the injured. A Sister Church medical team on the ground right now has been helping as much as they can with the overwhelming need at the mission hospital.

RMI is UNIQUELY positioned to help these refugees. With their extensive base of operations, their on-site staff, their network of community contacts in the south of Haiti, and their Sister Churches and many friends, **THEY CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE!**

Their strategy is to minister to the masses of refugees pouring into southern Haiti by providing:

- Medical supplies and short term medical teams to help in the hospitals.
- Food and basic necessities for the refugees
- Short-term housing as possible
- Spiritual encouragement and witness

Please pray for the people of Haiti and give as you are able so we can help our Haitian brothers and sisters. Thank you!

Contributions for Haiti Relief - In January the congregation contributed \$13,153 for Haiti relief. We are sending a check for this amount to RMI (Reciprocal Ministries International) immediately for the many needs associated with the earthquake and RMI's sister churches.

If you have contributed to Haiti earthquake relief, you should know that a new law allows you to deduct such contributions on your 2009 tax return instead of your 2010 return. (Contributions must be made before March 1, 2010.) In preparing your 2009 tax return, you may treat such contributions as if they had been made on December 31, 2009. Great Valley will continue to record all such contributions as of the date received (Calendar year 2010), and they will appear in your 2010 year-end Statement of Giving, regardless of whether you claim them on your 2009 or 2010 tax return.
