Question: For What, or for Whom are We Waiting?

I. For One Who is Enthroned (vs. 1)

~ see Phil. 2:9-11

II. For One Who Reigns as King (vs. 2-3)

~ see Acts 1:8

III. For One Who is the Great High Priest (vs.4)

"And every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sacrificed." Heb. 10:11-14

IV. For One Who Will Come in Judgement (vs.5-7)
