**Question:** How often are we blind (clueless) to the kingdom implications of the world around us? To the extent we are blind, then what must we do?

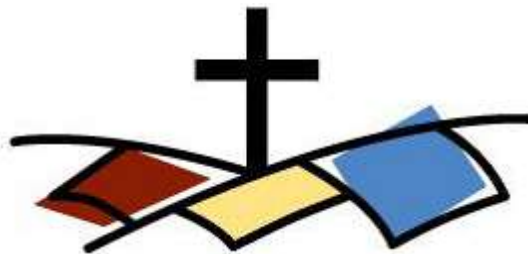
*For at the window of my house
