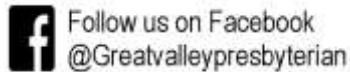

#136 – “Man of Sorrows,” What a Name

ABOUT THIS EVENING'S SERVICE

It is a joy and a privilege to gather together to praise our God. May you sense His presence here today in worship and fellowship (Heb. 10:25).

Maundy Thursday gets its name from the Latin word *mandatum* which means “commandment” and points to the words of Christ in the Upper Room at the Last Supper, “A new commandment I give you: Love one another (John 13:34).” The events of that night included Christ’s betrayal and arrest – events which lead us to the foot of the cross.

We come together as people of that cross. We celebrate our communion (our togetherness) because of this night’s memory of a supper instituted by Jesus. Let us in quietness reflect on His life and work for us.

Invitation to Communion – All who truly repent of their sins, and who look to the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior are invited to take the bread and cup in celebration of his death and resurrection, and in so doing to testify to our faith until he comes again.
